



## WE PRACTICE HUMILITY WHEN WE'RE CAREFUL NOT TO OFFEND ONE ANOTHER

"To verbally disapprove of something (behavior, attitude, expression)"




# WE PRACTICE HUMILITY WHEN WE'RE WILLING TO EXTEND GODLY FORGIVENESS

Of course not. 10 In the same way, when you obey me you should say, 'We are unworthy servants who have simply done our duty."
