


The Gospel of **LUKE**

The Practice of Humility

Luke 17

¹ One day Jesus said to his disciples, “There will always be temptations to sin, but what sorrow awaits the person who does the tempting! ² It would be better to be thrown into the sea with a millstone hung around your neck than to cause one of these little ones to fall into sin.

GREEK: SCANDALIDZO;
**“To set a stumbling block or
obstacle in a path causing
someone to trip and stumble.”**



**WE PRACTICE HUMILITY WHEN WE'RE
CAREFUL NOT TO OFFEND ONE ANOTHER**

³ So watch yourselves! “If another believer sins, rebuke that person; then if there is repentance, forgive. ⁴ Even if that person wrongs you seven times a day and each time turns again and asks forgiveness, you must forgive.”

REBUKE;

**“To verbally disapprove of something
(behavior, attitude, expression)”**

WILLING TO EXTEND GODLY FORGIVENESS**

⁵ The apostles said to the Lord, “Show us how to increase our faith.” ⁶ The Lord answered, “If you had faith even as small as a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, ‘May you be uprooted and be planted in the sea,’ and it would obey you!”

Luke 17

⁷ “When a servant comes in from plowing or taking care of sheep, does his master say, ‘Come in and eat with me’? ⁸ No, he says, ‘Prepare my meal, put on your apron, and serve me while I eat. Then you can eat later.’ ⁹ And does the master thank the servant for doing what he was told to do? Of course not. ¹⁰ In the same way, when you obey me you should say, ‘We are unworthy servants who have simply done our duty.’”
