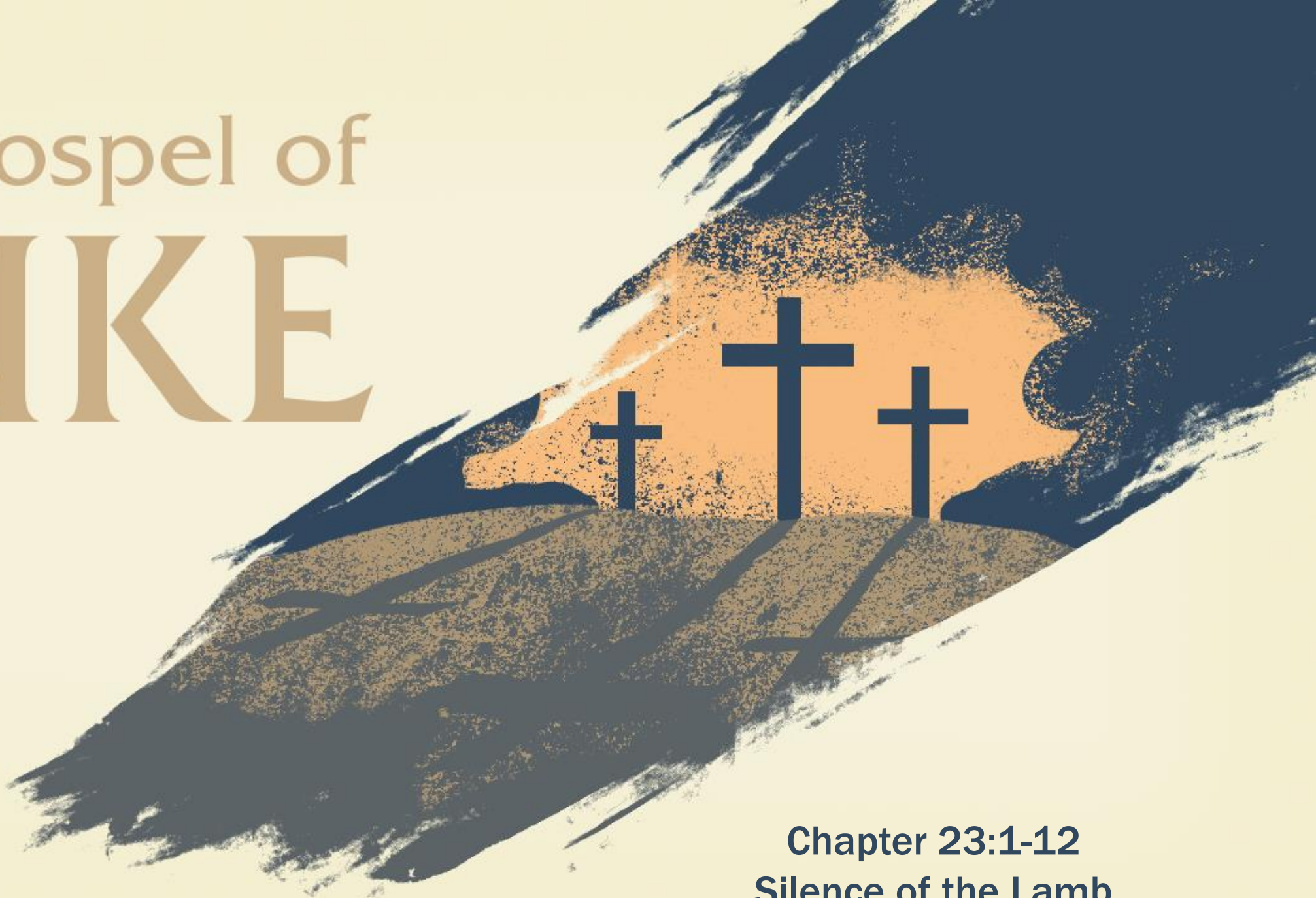


# The Gospel of LUKE



**Chapter 23:1-12**  
**Silence of the Lamb**

## Luke 23

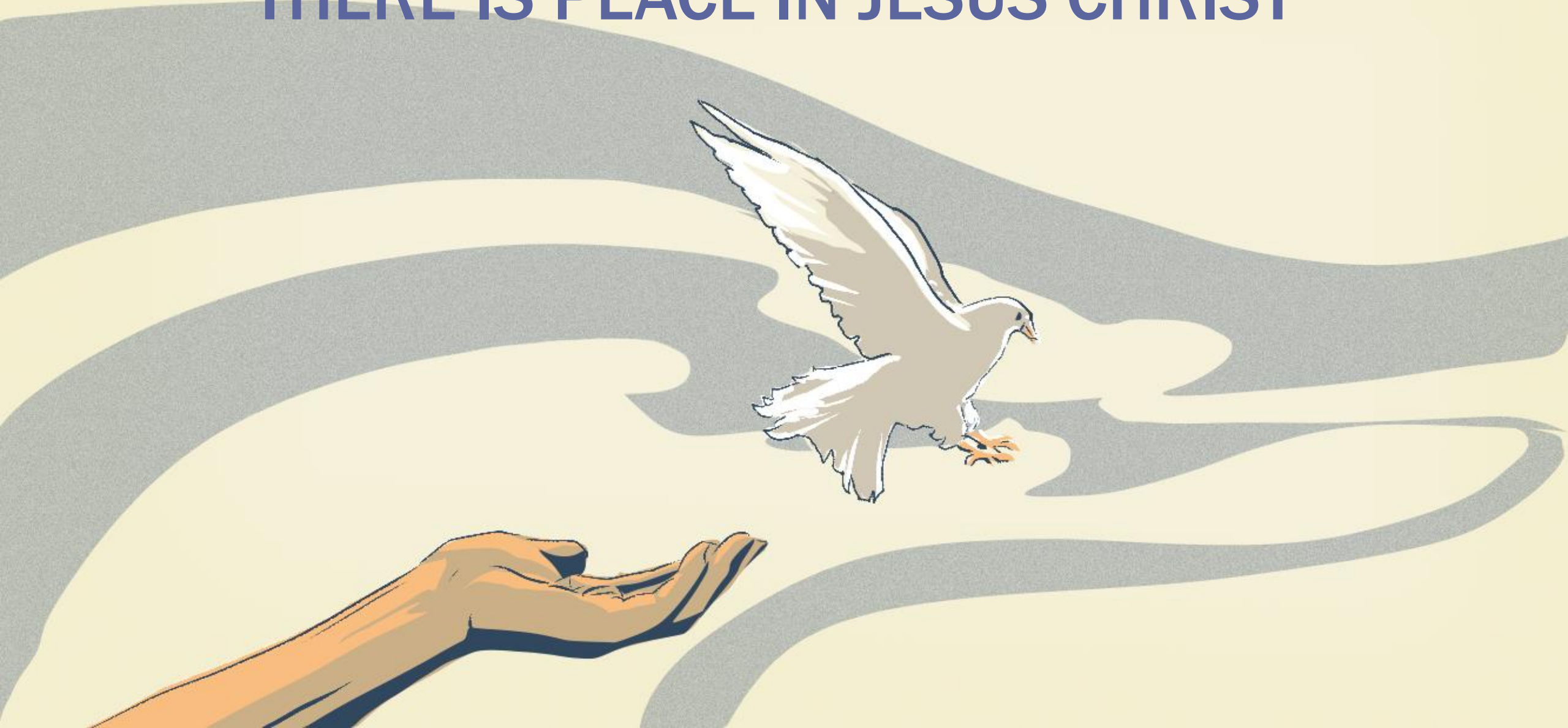
<sup>1</sup> Then the entire council took Jesus to Pilate, the Roman governor. <sup>2</sup> They began to state their case: “This man has been leading our people astray by telling them not to pay their taxes to the Roman government and by claiming he is the Messiah, a king.” <sup>3</sup> So Pilate asked him, “Are you the king of the Jews?” Jesus replied, “You have said it.”

<sup>4</sup> Pilate turned to the leading priests and to the crowd and said, “I find nothing wrong with this man!” <sup>5</sup> Then they became insistent. “But he is causing riots by his teaching wherever he goes—all over Judea, from Galilee to Jerusalem!”<sup>6</sup> “Oh, is he a Galilean?” Pilate asked. <sup>7</sup> When they said that he was, Pilate sent him to Herod Antipas, because Galilee was under Herod’s jurisdiction, and Herod happened to be in Jerusalem at the time.

<sup>8</sup> Herod was delighted at the opportunity to see Jesus, because he had heard about him and had been hoping for a long time to see him perform a miracle. <sup>9</sup> He asked Jesus question after question, but Jesus refused to answer. <sup>10</sup> Meanwhile, the leading priests and the teachers of religious law stood there shouting their accusations.

<sup>11</sup> Then Herod and his soldiers began mocking and ridiculing Jesus. Finally, they put a royal robe on him and sent him back to Pilate. <sup>12</sup> (Herod and Pilate, who had been enemies before, became friends that day.)
